


OUR PEOPLE, OUR WORLD

NEEDS THE COMMUNITY DEEMS MOST IMPORTANT

Obesity-Chronic Disease

- Costs MS \$925M/year in healthcare costs
- Cause of many other chronic diseases like heart disease, high blood pressure, diabetes

Stress

- Contributes to chronic disease and mental disorders
- Obesity AND Stress lead to chronic disease

Senior Isolation-highest risk ages 65 and older

MS has highest risk which leads to depression and other health issues



NEEDS THE COMMUNITY DEEMS MOST IMPORTANT

Youth Related Issues

 Includes childhood obesity, crime, bullying to social isolation and leads to depression and health issues

Juvenile Crime

Costs MS \$93K/day

Poverty

19.8% of the MS population had incomes below the poverty line

WHY THE Y IS SEEN AS A POSITIVE SOLUTION

- The Y is seen as a trusted high quality / low cost community resource for both health and wellness and youth development services.
- Price and convenience are core consideration factors, which the I-10 / Hwy 605 location can accommodate along with the Y's low cost and scholarship opportunities.
- The Y is top ranked organization to provide services to the communities along the Gulf.
 - Community believes the Y contributes to quality of life.
 - The Y is a family friendly community resource open to all.



Y PROGRAMS DESIRED THAT RESOLVE COMMUNITY NEEDS

- Water safety and swim lessons
- Weight loss programs to fight obesity, stress, and chronic disease
- Personal training options
- Nutrition classes
- Senior specific fitness classes
- Enrichment classes (arts, crafts, photography, computers, cooking)

ECONOMIC GROWTH

- Before and After-school programs allow 1640 parents to work outside the home.
- Estimated annual earnings of these parents \$50,274 (Jackson County Median Income).



ECONOMIC IMPACT THROUGH EDUCATION

- 1,020 children, adolescents and older teens participated in a wide variety of education programs designed to help them improve their achievement levels, reduce drop-out rates and encourage higher education.
- We estimate that each year these programs could add more than \$8 million to potential lifetime earnings of current participants.



ECONOMIC IMPACT FOR THE STATE AND COMMUNITY

- Over \$500,000 in Y scholarship assistance provided to low income families and communities in the last five years.
- Communities with a Y are more attractive and richer in quality to perspective businesses and employees.

- Property values increase.
- Improved quality of life-more recreational and educational opportunities.
- Because the Y can provide these services they relieve the community and state of financial burden of long term services.



ECONOMIC IMPACT JOB CREATION

- The Y will employ 70 full-time equivalent jobs and an additional 17 jobs for Y suppliers.
- Compensation to employees is \$2,070,820.
- Direct compensation to Y employees and indirect compensation to suppliers and their suppliers totals \$2,545,456.

YOUTH DEVELOPMENT

- Mississippi Gulf Coast residents
 are no strangers to the dangers
 of water in our community due
 to the prevalence of bodies
 of water.
- Drowning is the second leading cause of death in children next to automobile accidents in Mississippi.
- For every person who dies from drowning another five receive emergency department care for nonfatal submersion injuries.
- More single parents in the Gulfport area need support in raising their families.

Y SOLUTION: WATER SAFETY A LIFELONG SKILL-LEARNING TO SWIM

The Y is the leading provider of swim lessons and has taught America's kids how to swim for over 100 years. For over 30 years the Mississippi Gulf Coast YMCA has taught over 12,000 third graders to swim.

The Y prepares all people for this skill through:

- Teaching third grade swim.
- Safety Around the Water program to prevent drowning, teach swim lessons, public awareness and elementary school education.
- Mobile Swim.
- Lifesaving and CPR programs.

HEALTHY LIVING

- Obesity in children and adults is the leading health concern in Mississippi and the highest in the nation.
- Mississippi ranks first in the nation for overall diabetes prevalence with over 333,026 (14.7% of population)
- Chronic diseases like diabetes, high blood pressure, heart disease, arthritis, Parkinson's, and obesity are being addressed everyday in programs at the Y.

Y SOLUTION: HEALTHY LIVING

The Y is committed to helping all families to learn, grow and thrive through guidance in healthy living.

The Y is expanding healthy living opportunities and fighting chronic disease through:

- Diabetes Prevention Program.
- Blood Pressure Self Monitoring programs.
- Healthy Weight & Your Child programs.
- Parkinson's health and wellness programs.
- Enhance Fitness program (arthritis).

SOCIAL RESPONSIBLILITY

- Social barriers and disparities often prevent participation.
- More lower incomes in need of scholarships in Gulfport Mississippi.
- \$93.4 thousand per day spent on juvenile facilities.

Y SOLUTION: SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY

- The Y is for everybody and open to ALL.
- Scholarship subsidies make sure that everyone desiring a Y experience can participate.
- Yon the Fly aids to expand the reach of the MS Gulf Coast YMCA into neighborhoods outside our Y's, and to serve youth in underprivileged neighborhoods.

MORE...

- 504 children and families were served by the Mississippi Gulf Coast YMCA and over \$138,000 in scholarships awarded.
- For every \$1 that is donated to the Y \$1.50 is given back to the community.
- The Y provides a safe place for kids to go.
- The Y teaches character building values like Caring,
 Honesty, Respect and Responsibility.

- As an approach, the synergies modeled for this partnership type have proven beneficial in expanding the Mission and delivery of much needed Y programs while also re-positioning existing communities.
- The inclusion of the Y facilities amidst retail and commercial offerings of new residential/mixed use developments have stimulated growth, and the pace of growth, in planned urban developments nationwide.
